Going online opened many doors for clients who were otherwise too far out of reach to attend in-person classes. Being online allowed our facilitators to go into their homes virtually, providing the tools they need to create safe, loving homes for their children. Ultimately, the pandemic was a catalyst to spur our creativity, embrace new opportunities and end the year serving more families than ever before.

With its myriad of challenges, 2020 was also designated as a strategic planning season. This thoughtful process brought a realization that it was time to find a new way to communicate NewDay's goals and vision. All children grow and thrive because parents work courageously to provide a safe, loving home.

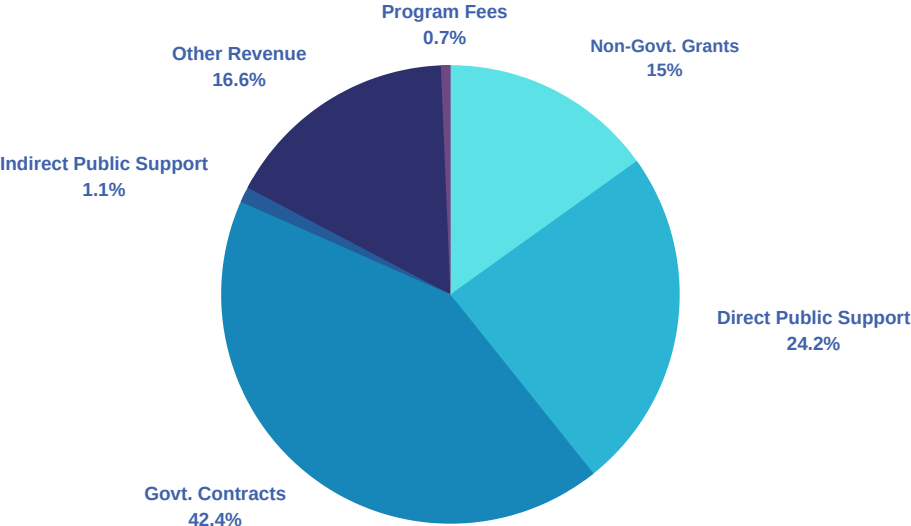
The need is greater than ever. Moving forward, NewDay will continue striving toward the goal of "Helping parents be parents, so kids can be KIDS!"

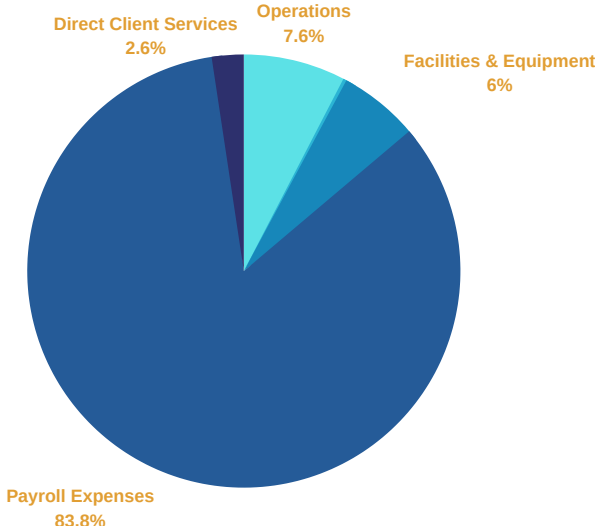

MENTOR-NAVIGATION



Because our clients too often come to us lacking the protective factors necessary to adequately provide for their children emotionally, physically, and relationally, NewDay Services provides a highly relational, dedicated point of contact to help fathers/mothers realize their potential as parents.

Mentor-Navigation seeks to directly increase parents' resilience and ability to access concrete and social supports through life-coaching, service coordination, case management, and crisis intervention. Outcomes of these interventions are greater parent skills and efficacy, self-sufficiency, improved personal well-being, healthy relationships, and access to resources.

NewDay has been proud to partner with James Bell Associates and the Annie E. Casey Foundation in 2020 and looks forward to working together in 2021 to create an evidence-based model of this successful addition to our FOCUS programs (FOCUS+).
